**Plan in Advance:** During winter break, students must find temporary accommodations and meal options, as campus residence halls and dining options will close. During spring break, campus residence halls will remain open, but dining options will close.

**Meal Plans:** Some meal plans provide the equivalent of three meals per day in the dining hall, while other meal plan options include more flexible “dining dollars” that can be used at a variety of on-campus dining options.

## IMPORTANT DATES

**November:** Admitted students can apply for housing at [housing.iupui.edu](http://housing.iupui.edu) by submitting an online form and \$50 fee.

**March 15:** Deadline for priority consideration for on-campus housing; students wanting to live on campus should apply for housing before this date.

**April - June:** Housing contract offers are sent to students each Thursday. Students have 5 days to sign the contract and pay the \$400 non-refundable deposit to secure their spot.

**June - July:** Students can view early move-in dates, associated early move-in fees, and early move in applications when arriving prior to early move in dates.
